26% are single parents (324 children)







State Financial Aid for DREAMers

Eligibility for several Washington State financial aid programs has expanded to include students who are ineligible for federal financial aid due to immigration status. Students who meet individual program, income, or residency requirements for the State Need Grant, the College Bound Scholarship, State Work Study, or Passport Scholarship should complete the free WASFA (Washington Application for State Financial Aid) to apply for state financial aid.

HB 1079

House Bill 1079 was passed into law in 2003 and allows many undocumented students in the state of WA to receive in-state tuition.

REQUIREMENTS

- Graduated High School or Received a GED in Washington State
- Lived in Washington for at least three years prior to receiving a diploma or GED in a high school or other institution in the State of Washington;

- Has been accepted to a Washington State college or university;
- Signs an affidavit stating he or she will apply for U.S. residency as soon as possible.

WASFA

Who can apply?










Independent Students

- Over 24 years old
- Homeless or "couch-surfing"
- Former Foster care after age 16
- Parents are not legal guardians
- Parent is incarcerated
- There can be other circumstances, just ask!

"Unusual Circumstances"

Students requiring independent student status will be required to do additional paperwork by their college.
